 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Regional China Officer
- 3 Authorization Act".
- 4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 5 Congress finds the following:
- 6 (1) The Department of State started the Re-
- 7 gional China Officer (RCO) program in 2019 with
- 8 six officers deployed overseas.
- 9 (2) As of January 2025, the program had
- grown in size to 20 RCO positions, spanning across
- all the regional bureaus.
- 12 (3) RCOs assess and report on emerging pat-
- terns in activity by the People's Republic of China
- 14 (PRC), help United States diplomatic missions focus
- on the most important, PRC-related, United States
- priorities, and help coordinate effective messaging
- and strategies to counter PRC malign influence in
- the region.
- 19 (4) The RCO program is part of the Office of
- 20 China Coordination in the Bureau of East Asia and
- 21 Pacific Affairs at the State Department.
- 22 SEC. 3. SENSE OF CONGRESS.
- 23 It is the sense of Congress that—
- 24 (1) the United States is engaged in a global
- competition for influence with the People's Republic
- of China (PRC), which requires that the United

1	States adequately monitor and analyze PRC malign
2	activity that is contrary to United States interests
3	globally;
4	(2) the RCO program is a key asset for the De-
5	partment of State in the context of strategic com-
6	petition with China at the global, regional, and sub-
7	regional levels; and
8	(3) the United States must continue to counter
9	PRC activities that seek to coerce other countries,
10	distort markets, and undermine United States inter-
11	ests.
12	SEC. 4. REGIONAL CHINA PROGRAM UNIT.
13	(a) AUTHORIZATION.—The Secretary of State shall
14	establish within the Office of China Coordination of the
15	Bureau of East Asia and Pacific Affairs a Regional China
16	Officer Program Unit.
17	(b) Staffing.—The Regional China Officer Pro-
18	gram Unit shall be comprised of—
19	(1) one Director appointed in accordance with
20	subsection (c); and
21	(2) not fewer than 20 forward-deployed Foreign
22	Service Officers assigned to United States diplo-
23	matic or consular posts or detailed to the foreign
24	ministry of an ally, to be known as Regional China
25	Officers (RCOs), who shall be responsible for—

1	(A) monitoring and reporting on activities
2	of the People's Republic of China in the region
3	of his or her responsibility, including in the
4	commercial, development, finance, critical infra-
5	structure, technology, and military domains, in-
6	cluding projects associated with the PRC's Belt
7	and Road Initiative, Global Security Initiative,
8	and Global Development Initiative; and
9	(B) advising United States embassy per-
10	sonnel, diplomatic allies and partners, and host
11	countries on how to understand and address
12	PRC activities globally and locally.
13	(c) Director of the Regional China Officer
14	Program.—
15	(1) In general.—Not later than 90 days after
16	the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
17	of State shall appoint a Director for the Regional
18	China Officer Program Unit from among career
19	members of the Foreign Service.
20	(2) Limitation on Position.—The establish-
21	ment of the position of the Director pursuant to this
22	section shall not result in an increase in the overall
23	full-time equivalent positions within the Department.

1	(3) Responsibilities.—The Director shall be
2	responsible for coordinating and overseeing the ac-
3	tivities of RCOs in order to—
4	(A) improve United States responsiveness
5	to activities, strategies and tactics of the Peo-
6	ple's Republic of China (PRC);
7	(B) ensure that RCO program activities in-
8	crease the knowledge, understanding, and trust
9	of the United States by relevant target audi-
10	ences;
11	(C) identify gaps in United States engage-
12	ments regarding PRC cross-cutting activities;
13	and
14	(D) manage hiring for RCO positions.
15	(d) REGIONAL CHINA OFFICERS.—
16	(1) QUALIFICATIONS.—The Secretary of State
17	shall select and assign RCOs from among Foreign
18	Service Officers who have expertise related to the
19	PRC, including in the forms of prior experience
20	working in or on China, Taiwan, and Hong Kong,
21	and proficiency in Mandarin language.
22	(2) Geographic placement.—Of the total
23	number of RCOs in the Regional China Officer Pro-
24	gram Unit, there shall be no fewer than 2 Regional
25	China Officers assigned to United States diplomatic

1	posts associated with each of the following bu-
2	reaus—
3	(A) Bureau of African Affairs;
4	(B) Bureau of East Asian and Pacific Af-
5	fairs;
6	(C) Bureau of European and Eurasian Af-
7	fairs;
8	(D) Bureau of International Organization
9	Affairs;
10	(E) Bureau of Near Eastern Affairs;
11	(F) Bureau of South and Central Asian
12	Affairs; and
13	(G) Bureau of Western Hemisphere Af-
14	fairs.
15	(e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—
16	(1) Expansion of the RCO program.—There
17	is authorized to be appropriated \$2,500,000 for each
18	of fiscal years 2026 through 2030 to—
19	(A) expand the RCO program at strategic
20	United States diplomatic missions and at the
21	foreign ministries of allies; and
22	(B) support the management of the RCO
23	program, including one Locally Employed Staff
24	support position in each geographic region.

1	(2) Programs and activities.—There is au-
2	thorized to be appropriated \$1,250,000 for each of
3	fiscal years 2026 through 2030 with up to \$50,000
4	for each Regional China Officer to support programs
5	and public diplomacy activities of the Regional
6	China Officer Program.
7	(3) Availability.—Amounts appropriated pur-
8	suant to the authorizations under this section are
9	authorized to remain available until expended and
10	shall be in addition to amounts otherwise authorized
11	to be appropriated for the Countering PRC Influ-
12	ence Fund.
13	(f) Sunset.—The requirement to maintain the Re-
14	gional China Officer Program Unit and the Regional
15	China Officer Program under subsection (a) shall expire
16	on the date that is 5 years after the date of the enactment
17	of this Act.
18	(g) Ally Defined.—In this Act, the term "ally"
19	means only—
20	(1) a member country of the North Atlantic
21	Treaty Organization; or
22	(2) a country designated as a major non-NATO
23	ally pursuant to the authorities provided by section
24	517 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22
25	U.S.C. 2321k).
