African leaders, as well as civil society, business, diaspora, women, and youth leaders. 3 U.S.-AFRICA CITY SUMMIT ("Mini Sum-MIT").—The Secretary of State should host one U.S.-Afri-5 ca City Summit ("Mini Summit") every four years, to take place two years after the most recent U.S.-Africa Leaders 6 Summit described in subsection (a), across cities in Africa 8 or the United States, or more frequently as appropriate, to promote subregional cooperation and serve as a catalyst in fostering engagement with representatives of govern-10 ment, civil society, business, academia, youth, culture and 12 the arts, the African diaspora community, and underrep-13 resented groups. (c) U.S.-AFRICA LEADERS SUMMIT IMPLEMENTA-14 15 TION UNIT.— 16 (1) In General.—The Secretary of State is 17 authorized to establish within the Bureau for Afri-18 can Affairs of the Department of State a U.S.-Afri-19 ca Leaders Summit implementation unit responsible 20 for overseeing the implementation of commitments 21 made at summits described in this section. 22 (2) Duties.—The duties of the implementation 23 unit authorized by this subsection shall include—
